Assessment Methods:

Must be assessed and quality assured in accordance with the Minerals Matter SSO Mineral Products Assessment Strategy and MP Awards' evidence requirements.

For this qualification, all learning outcomes must be assessed using methods appropriate to the assessment of competence-based qualifications. There must be valid, authentic and sufficient evidence for all the assessment criteria. There is no requirement for each unit to be assessed separately. Minimum Performance Evidence Requirements:

Competence must be demonstrated by repeatable performance in the workplace and must include a minimum of 2 observations on different dates. The **recommended minimum** timeframe for the qualification is 10 weeks. This is measured from the date the candidate is registered to the date the Assessor signs off the achievement record. There is a **mandatory minimum timeframe** of 4 weeks measured from the first assessment judgement made by the Assessor to when the achievement record is signed off.

Assessing Knowledge and Understanding:

For this qualification all learning outcomes must be assessed using methods appropriate to the assessment of workplace knowledge and understanding. There must be valid, authentic and sufficient evidence for all of the assessment criteria. The examples in the list are not exhaustive.

Holistic approach is encouraged: Verbal/written questioning (recorded); Professional interview (recorded); coursework; candidate statements

Assessment System:

Whilst Approved Centres are free to develop their own assessment record system; MP Awards has developed a ready-made system for Centres to use which is available at no cost. However, Centres are advised to check with MP Awards when devising their own assessment system to ensure it meets the standards in full.
